S. 535 would allow the National Global War on Terrorism Memorial to be placed in the area known as the Reserve, that is, the area from the United States Capitol to the Lincoln Memorial, and from the White House to the Jefferson Memorial. Under current law, commemorative works like the National Global War on Terrorism Memorial are not permitted in the Reserve.

Since the memorial is authorized under current law, CBO estimates that specifying its location would have no effect on the federal budget.
