The nonemergency totals include 2011 scoring from 2010 supplemental appropriations acts (P.L. 111-212, P.L. 111-224, P.L. 111-230). The House and Senate Budget Committees have differing interpretations of the emergency designation for certain accounts in P.L. 111-212. The House interpretation is incorporated in the nonemergency amounts of this table. The table excludes the 2011 scoring for emergencies in the 2010 enacted supplementals, as amended by this Act (see footnote 2). Those total are: BA = \$3,217 million, outlays = \$26,314 million.

Section 1858 repeals section 10108 (Free choice vouchers) of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148). This repeal results in an increase in revenues of \$120 million over the 2011-2016 period, and \$420 million of the 2011-2021 period.

- 1. Section 2030 of Division B provides an emergency designation for section 902 of P. L. 111-212 (the Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2010). This allows the House and Senate Budget Committees to have the same interpretation of the emergency designation for this section.
- 2. Section 1119 of Division B provides for an across-the-board rescission of 0.2% to all 2011 discretionary budget authority except budget authority provided in Division A (Defense Appropriations Act, 2011), and budget authority provided for contingency operations. The Senate shows the scoring of this section to the full committee.
