H.R. 2046 would establish the position of Assistant Secretary for the Bureau of Energy Resources to manage energy policy within the Department of State. It also would delineate the responsibilities of that bureau. On the basis of information from the department about the bureau's current staffing and responsibilities, CBO estimates that the bill would codify current policies and practices. Thus, enacting the bill would not affect the federal budget. The bureau currently has 60 positions and an annual budget of \$13 million.
