H.R. 1492 would authorize the National Park Service (NPS) to acquire, by donation, approximately 160 acres of land to add to the existing Yucca House National Monument.

Using information from the NPS, CBO anticipates that the agency would accept the donated land and process the transfer in the first year following enactment. CBO estimates that the cost to process the real estate transaction and perform environmental inspections would not be significant. Any spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
