H.R. 1510 would direct the Department of Veterans Affairs to report to the Congress about how video cameras are used at the department's medical facilities to improve patient safety and law enforcement. Using information on similar reports, CBO estimates that satisfying the reporting requirement would cost less than \$500,000 over the 2021-2026 period; such spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
