S. 3785 would eliminate a provision under current law that prohibits a retired or former regular officer of the Armed Forces from serving as the Deputy Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) if the current FAA Administrator is also a former regular officer of the Armed Forces.

The act would not affect the Deputy Administrator’s compensation and would not change the number of available positions. Accordingly, CBO estimates that implementing S. 3785 would not affect the federal budget.
