

## H.R. 3034, A bill to amend title 28, United States Code, to provide an additional place for holding court for the Western District of Washington, and for other purposes

H.R. 3034 would authorize federal courts in the Western District of the state of Washington to hold proceedings in the city of Mount Vernon. Under current law, federal courts are authorized to hold proceedings in the cities of Bellingham, Seattle, Tacoma, and Vancouver.

Using information from the Administrative Office of the United States Courts, CBO expects that federal judges would hold some proceedings in facilities owned by Skagit County and that implementing the bill would cost less than \$500,000 over the 2022-2027 period. Such spending would be subject to the availability of appropriated funds.
