



## Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources

The Congressional Budget Act of 1974 requires the Congressional Budget Office, to the extent practicable, to prepare estimates of the budgetary effects of legislation ordered reported by Congressional authorizing committees. In order to provide the Congress with as much information as possible, the attached table summarizes information about the estimated direct spending and revenue effects of some of the legislation that has been ordered reported by the **Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources** during the 117th Congress. The legislation listed in this table generally would have small effects, if any, on direct spending or revenues, CBO estimates. Where possible, the table also provides information about the legislation's estimated effects on spending subject to appropriation and on intergovernmental and private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

CBO estimates that enacting S. 1538 would have an insignificant effect on direct spending and no effect on revenues over the 2023-2032 period. CBO has not estimated the discretionary costs of implementing the bill. CBO cannot determine the amount of funding the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service would need to implement the extended authorities; thus, CBO has not estimated the bill's discretionary costs. S. 2367 would authorize the Department of the Interior to acquire up to 20 acres of land in Maryland to accommodate additional needs of the National Park Service's Historic Preservation Center. The bill would authorize the appropriation of such sums necessary to acquire the land, which could also be acquired by donation or transfer from a willing owner. CBO estimates that enacting S. 2367 would not affect direct spending or revenues. CBO has not estimated the discretionary costs of implementing the bill. The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

S. 2438 would expand the boundary of the Cane River Creole National Historical Park in Louisiana to include an additional 46.1 acres of adjoining land. CBO estimates that enacting S. 2438 would not affect direct spending or revenues. CBO has not estimated the discretionary costs of implementing the bill. The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

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S. 2561 would amend current law to exempt the Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management from requirements to reopen approved land management plans for consultation if a new endangered species or critical habitat is identified in a plan's area. CBO estimates that enacting S. 2561 would not affect direct spending or revenues. CBO has not estimated the discretionary costs of implementing the bill. The bill contains no intergovernmental or private-sector mandates as defined in the Unfunded Mandates Reform Act.

The bill also would extend the deadline for completing work under a pilot program to mitigate the effects of the drought in the Colorado River basin. CBO estimates that enacting S. 2693 would not affect direct spending or revenues. The legislation would authorize activities that would not necessarily be covered by the authorized appropriations; thus, CBO has not estimated the full discretionary costs of implementing the bill. CBO estimates that enacting S. 3046 would have an insignificant effect on net direct spending and no effect on revenues over the 2023-2032 period. CBO has not estimated the discretionary costs of implementing the bill. | <p>S. 3185 would extend the authority of the National Park Service to give permits to certain vehicles to pass through the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area and, through September 30, 2026, to collect annual fees of \$200 per vehicle (which are treated in the budget as offsets to direct spending). That authority expired on September 30, 2022. CBO estimates that enacting S. 3185 would have an insignificant effect on direct spending and no effect on revenues over the 2023-2032 period. CBO estimates that there would be no effect on spending subject to appropriation. CBO has not estimated the discretionary costs of implementing the bill. | <p>S. 3450 would authorize the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) to develop hydropower generation facilities through a lease with a private entity in Montana's Sun River project. Under that agreement, private entities would pay BOR fees based on the amount of energy produced by the project; those fees could be spent or applied to outstanding obligations for the project. CBO estimates that enacting the bill would, on net, increase offsetting receipts (or decrease direct spending) by less than \$500,000 over the 2023-2032 period. CBO estimates that implementing the bill would not affect discretionary spending. Enacting the bill would not affect revenues.
